The Renaissance

The Renaissance was a period in history from the 14th century to the 17th century. It started in Italy and at first it affected major cities such as Florence, Rome and Milan.

The Renaissance was known as the "rebirth" - the birth of the modern world, a change from old to new. During this time artists and scholars experimented with new ideas, techniques and mediums to produce fresh and exciting pieces of work.



Why the Renaissance?

Life in the Middle Ages was thought to be quite dull. Not many people during this time knew how to read or had the desire to investigate the world around them. A group of Italian writers and scholars wanted to improve their knowledge and become more educated. They thought the Middle Ages were the "Dark Ages" and tried everything they could to discover new skills and ideas. They were known as the "Humanists".


Leonardo Da Vinci was born on the 15th of April 1452 in a small Tuscan village in Italy.

At the age of fifteen he became an apprentice artist, goldsmith and sculptor. In 1482 Leonardo da Vinci moved to Milan where he continued painting and became a military expert and engineer. He designed machines that could be used by men at war and investigated how to make objects fly.

An influential man

Leonardo da Vinci was self-educated. This meant he researched and investigated a range of topics without a teacher's direction. As a result of this he became knowledgeable in the areas of science, technology, art, literature, war, human anatomy and the world in general.

He wrote all of his ideas in notebooks with encrypted messages that were hard to decode. Many people asked him questions about his ideas as they were interested in his findings and knowledge.

New techniques

While Leonardo da Vinci lived in Milan he designed many models to be sculpted and painted many paintings. He investigated new techniques and theories every day to improve his skills.


Two of his most famous paintings were the MONA LISA and THE LAST SUPPER.

Leonardo drew images of the world around him which were the inspiration for the majority of his paintings.




He drew diagrams of human anatomy, plants and inventions and shared his new ideas with like-minded people.

A famous man



Leonardo da Vinci became so famous throughout his life that the French King asked him to move to Paris, France.




He agreed to move to France where he lived in the King's guest house. Leonardo continued drawing, painting and investigating scientific theories until he died on the 2nd of May 1519, aged 67.
