Topic (Geography): The location of Hong Kong and the Continent of Asia. Building on pupils' knowledge of the difference between human and physical landmarks in the UK, pupils learn the basic physical and human features of Lamma island, including harbours, villages, forests, beaches and mountains. They learn some simple human and physical features of Hong Kong Island, including transport and housing. They compare these with own locality and learn the terms urban and rural to describe places. They build on their knowledge of hot and cold places and the location of the equator to understand the climate of Hong Kong. Science: The children are introduced to the concept of five senses that help them to find out about the world around them and link those senses to particular parts of their body. Each sense is explored by children as they answer a variety of science questions.
