The Bible mentions equality on many occasions. It tells us that everyone is equal no matter your race, gender or social status. Below are some verses about equality.


Galatians 3:28 "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."
