Information texts would include sub-headings and technical vocabulary; a recipe would need adverbials, imperative verbs etc. This will vary depending on what you decide to write.

I do want you to ensure you are using a variety of sentence structures, excellent vocabulary and a range of punctuation. Here are a few reminders.

# Relative clauses/parenthesis

The virus - which is called COVID 19 - became a Pandemic. (non-fiction)

My teacher (Mr Gunning) set daily work via email. (diary)

The scientist, who had trained at Oxford University, made a remarkable discovery. (stroy)

#### **Subordinate clauses**

Despite the difficult situation, I soon settled into my new routine. (recount)

Because the mixture will be very runny, add more flour. (recipe)

The people queued like obedient soldiers whilst their families hid at home. (poem)

#### Colons

It was very clear that this virus had one goal: to kill! (non-fiction/story)

At the end of the garden something moved in the shadows: it must be Boris! (story/or even a recount)
