Otter Class Geography (The USA)

This term in Otter Class, we will finish learning about the USA. As part of this, children should learn to do the following things: the different types of food grown in the USA as well as some of the challenges farmers face in this region; explore the development of New York City through time, and the factors (and events in history) that has shaped the city that we see today (cross-curricular links with history). Below are some suggested activities for you to do with your child to support their learning in this area. Tasks 1A and 2A provide the knowledge needed to complete tasks 1B, 1C, 1D, 1E, 2B and 2C. 1E Pick three states in different areas of the country and produce a profile of farming activities that take place there. How do farming activities differ between these states? Using a computer research the history of this area in more detail. What is the main use of the space e.g are there lots of restaurants or business? Or is this area residential? This activity will allow you to investigate a time period, and place in more detail to explore why certain changes have happened.
