The first page provides a tour of Bath, showing you where Jane lived and visited - see if you or your parents recognise any of the streets and buildings. There is also a biography which you might find useful and some extra facts on the final page. Once you have gathered enough information about Jane Austen, you can start to write the biography in your books. Use the example from last week to help you layout the biography, headings might include: childhood and early life, becoming a novelist, links with Bath and Bristol, and personal life and legacy.</p>
