KS1 & KS2 Star Readers



Please find below the most recent OPAL survey that we have conducted with the children. As you can see, children are much more positive about their play experience at school. We recognise that there are still improvements to be made: more places to sit, consistency around messages from adults as well even more loose parts to play with. Mrs Rosie O'Rourke has been appointed as the school's Play Leader. She will coordinate more active and enjoyable lunchtimes for the children. Further to the feedback that we have received from parents, we have also introduced a **Stay and Play Club** which will take place on Tuesday afternoons. We are delighted that this club will be run by Mrs Obern and Mrs Bolton and that 36 children have signed up for Terms 3 and 4.
